

## I Imagine a WORLD with...

*Students in grades K-8: We want to see your vision for our world!*

*Close your eyes and imagine yourself as a grown-up.*

Where do you want to BE? \_\_\_\_\_

### Now turn your words into pictures...

1. Using a pencil and some scratch paper, SKETCH (quickly draw) a picture that represents your ideas. Do it quickly, and don't worry about the details. Just think about the lines, shapes, colors that come to your mind first.
2. Sketch a few times: do your ideas change? Do you want to add more details now? Are there people, animals, plants, or even words in your picture? Does your picture tell a story? You can use the same piece of scratch paper for all of your ideas.
3. Now take a clean sheet of paper, thicker if you have it. (You can come to YIA if you would like to use some of our paper or other supplies). You can use any color of paper, canvas, board, whatever you have at home to create your World. You also can build a 3D sculpture if you want. Just not too big or heavy please.
4. Fill the page with your most important ideas: colors, shapes, lines. What is in your imagination is MUCH more interesting than a plain old piece of paper!
5. Draw lightly with pencil first to make sure you are satisfied with your choices.
6. Choose the most important lines, and trace over them so that they show up better. (See the "Materials and Techniques" page for more ideas on how to use materials)
7. Add as much color and detail as you want.
8. When you are finished with your artwork, take a picture of it, and email the picture to Youth in Arts, at [yiagallery@youthinarts.org](mailto:yiagallery@youthinarts.org) by August 3.

### When you submit your artwork, please include:

- 1) Student Full Name and Grade (in September 2018)
- 2) Parent or Guardian Full Name and best phone, text and/or email contact
- 3) Title of Work and measurement in inches of height, width and depth
- 4) A photo of the work!
- 5) A sentence written (or dictated) by the student artist saying something about their artwork and/or the world they imagine for themselves. We want to know your story, so please tell us as much as you can.
- 6) Do you want to sell the artwork? If so, for how much? (Youth in Arts will take a commission of 30% so be sure to think of this when you set your price)
